### **Weeton Parish Council**

### Juniper Solar Farm

It is anticipated that the Juniper Solar Farm planning application will go before the North Yorkshire Council Strategic Planning Committee in either early February or early March '26. Ahead of this, the Planning Officer's report, which will contain a recommendation for the planning committee to consider, will be published.

### Outline planning permission for 4 dwellings in Huby

NYC has recently granted outline planning consent for the construction of 4 dwellings on part of the field to the North of the A658 through Huby. In their decision report the Planning Officer highlights the following aspects that, under current National Planning Policy, tipped the decision in favour of being granted:

- 1. The absence of a five-year housing land supply in North Yorkshire means there is currently a presumption in favour of sustainable development.
- 2. While the site is located within Green Belt it is assessed as meeting the definition of grey belt land and the application met various requirements for appropriate development of homes within Green Belt.
- 3. Although the site falls outside the current bounds of Huby its location close to public transport links represents a sustainable location for housing development.

The full decision report can be viewed on NYC Planning Portal, planning application reference 25/02659/OUT

While NYC has attached a condition to the approval that they will address the concern over an increased risk of flooding from the combined sewer as a result of the development, the Parish Council is seeking clarification as it appears to relate to mitigating against an increase in foul water discharge to the sewer rather than surface water.

### Remembrance Sunday.



Armistice Day this year marked the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of WW2, and our Remembrance Sunday service was, as always, very well attended. Visitors were greeted by Jean Matthewman's stunning display evergreens and red poppies, and Bruce Noble's drawing, a moving interpretation of John Singer Sargent's 1919 painting 'Gassed'. flanked the memorial on the north wall of the nave where the names of local men killed during WW1

are listed. At first glance the images of soldiers blinded and burned by mustard gas attack appear shocking, but on reflection there is also in the picture a glimmer of hope. As the young men support each other, they progress slowly forwards. *All is not lost,* they seem to say.

Visiting musician Karen Weaver from the Summerbridge and Dacre Silver Band sounded the Last Post and Reveille. Following a two-minute silence, Carol Simmonds read out the names of the fallen. David Yeadon read the Lesson, and Will Lewis was our organist. Leading the service, Moira Keith chose as her theme 'peace begins at home', reflecting that in modern times, just as during the two World Wars, bitterness at perceived injustices and envy of the good fortune of others can permeate the consciousness of the wider society with devastating consequences. In our present discordant times where peace can seem elusive, this is surely a message to mull over.

The annual pre-Christmas production by **KODS**, our village dramatic society, will this year showcase a plethora of local talent in a four-night and one matinée panto production of Cinderella. ### Dear Friends,

At Christmas, we once again find ourselves drawn to the familiar story of the birth of Jesus - the child laid in a manger, angels singing, shepherds hurrying from their fields and wise travellers following the light of a distant star. It is a story that speaks of peace, of hope, and of God's presence with us. But it is also a story that draws together



people from every walk of life - rich and poor, local and foreign, young and old - gathered in wonder around the Christ-child.

The coming of Jesus was God's declaration that every human life carries dignity and worth; that no one is beyond the reach of His grace.



This message feels particularly urgent in our own time. Across the globe and even close to home, we see the painful consequences division of marginalised groups feeling more excluded, politicians adopting extreme positions and communities fractured by fear or resentment. The temptation is to retreat into our own corners,

to see others as 'different' or 'against us'. Yet the Gospel calls us to resist such forces of separation.

Paul writes, "For He Himself is our peace, who has made the two groups one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility" (Ephesians 2:14).

In Christ, the walls that separate us are torn down and a new humanity is born - one reconciled to God and to one another. This is the peace that Christmas proclaims; not a fragile truce, but a radical, transforming love that unites strangers and heals what is broken.

To live as people of this peace is not always easy. It means choosing compassion over contempt, forgiveness over bitterness, dialogue over silence. It means seeing the image of God in the person before us - whether they are friend or stranger, refugee or neighbour. It means being willing to cross the boundaries that divide, just as God crossed every boundary to dwell among us in Jesus.

This Christmas, may we be bearers of that divine love. Let our celebrations be marked not only by joy, but by generosity of spirit. Let us open our hearts and homes, stand alongside the excluded and speak words that build up rather than tear down. For in doing so, we bear witness to the same light that shone over Bethlehem - a light that still breaks into the world's darkness and draws all people together.

May that light guide your steps, warm your homes and fill your hearts with the peace of Christ this Christmas and always.





### **North Rigton Parish Council**

### 1.Hall Green Lane/A658 junction

The Parish Council hosted an information event, prior to its November meeting, which allowed residents and other interested individuals (particularly those from Huby and Weeton) to submit their views on possible solutions, ask questions and hear about the successful and other actions put forward by the PC. All those present had the opportunity to question both the councillors and the Traffic Management Officer from North Yorkshire Police. Several interesting points emerged, particularly the need to also involve representatives from NYC Highways and Network Rail (soon to be part of the new combined authority – 'Great British Railways') Accordingly, a further meeting is to be arranged early in the new year, when all relevant authorities will hopefully be present.

(For a more detailed summary of all the issues raised, please see the Chaiman's report on the Council website)

### 2. Village Garden

In light of increasing maintenance costs, and in an effort hopefully to lessen the burden on council taxpayers, the Parish Council is setting up a system whereby users of the garden can make voluntary donations via a QR code, to be displayed in the garden. Sums collected will be assigned specifically to garden and play equipment maintenance.

### 3. High Moor Road

The road surface from the bend and up the hill into the village is appalling. The onset of winter and the inevitable spells of frost and ice, following heavy rain, will cause further deterioration and increase the risk of accidents. NYC Highways will again be alerted and the need for a comprehensive repair, ie total resurfacing, stressed.

### 4. Speed bumps

Given the ongoing increase in traffic flow through the village, largely due to 'rat runners', the Parish Council is giving serious consideration to the installation of speed bumps on the three roads through the village. Feasibility will be discussed with NYC.
