Thank you to Claire for her Parish update last month, so good I think she may have a future role!

It's that time of year again and the Parish Council would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a healthy and hearty Christmas and New year. Where did that year go, I wonder?

You may have seen in our social media that the Parish Council was so concerned about the proposed quantity of housing (2,705 dwellings) that has been allocated, or will have a direct impact upon the Parish in the proposed **New Swindon Plan**, that I wrote to James Coulstock, (jcoulstock@swindon.gov.uk) the Corporate Director who is in charge of Planning. I received a reply and an offer of a meeting during December and we will report on the outcome in our social media subsequently.

We seem to be spending a lot of time fighting what residents and the PC have decided are inappropriate Planning Applications at the Borough Council Planning Committee, and I must say a huge thank you to residents, whose fears we have supported, for speaking up too. If you have planning concerns about applications, please let us know and we always take them into consideration when we discuss them.



Blunsdon Social Walking Group 2025

At the beginning of 2024 we started a Social Walking Group here in Blunsdon. The main reasons were to get a chance to meet new people, get some gentle exercise and learn a little about the beautiful countryside around our village. And if the Community Shop gained a little more sales, that would be an additional benefit. Starting at 10am, on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of every month we do a circular walk, starting and ending at Blunsdon Community Shop. Walks are between 3 - 5 miles, and the routes are tailored depending on the time of year and the weather... and the amount of mud!

So far in 2025 we've done 21 walks, added to the 24 walks completed in 2024, makes a total of 45! If you'd attended all 45 (no-one has!) you'd have covered a distance of over 165 miles.

We've walked a total of 937 miles this year, with 34 different walkers. The average number of walkers is 11, but this year it's ranged from 7 to 16. At the end of 2024, thirty brave souls defied the weather to see Blunsdon Advent Windows, which we hope to repeat in 2026.

The Social aspect is at the heart of our Walking Group; we walk and chat. And maybe the best bit... we finish at our Community Cafe for Coffee & Cake! We'll be restarting in January 2026 so please join us! Jim Morris & Alex Kasperczak

I watched a child come out of school, sit on a bench and open the tin she was carefully carrying. With a look of pride and a big smile on her face she devoured one of the cupcakes she had made. I could imagine the teacher telling the children to take them home for their parents to see but she decided to enjoy one

first. It did make me smile.

As we are about to enter the Festive Season I thought I would give you recipes for some Christmas food gifts. I used these last year as extra little presents for family members, as there is nothing nicer than receiving a home-made foodie gift for Christmas.

Peanut Chunkies

Wash and dry a bag of salted peanuts 300g chocolate

A drop of vanilla essence Sprinkling of sea salt (optional)

Melt the chocolate, add the vanilla essence and sea salt. Mix through the peanuts. On a greaseproof lined baking sheet, spoon small bite size mounds. Leave to set in the fridge before storing in an airtight container.

Candied Spiced Nuts

(Keep 2-3 weeks) in a jar or freeze if making for yourself.

100g pecans, 120g walnuts, 20g melted coconut/olive oil, 24g brown sugar,

1 tsp cinnamon, 1 large pinch cayenne pepper, a few gratings of nutmeg,

¼ tsp sea salt, 2x 15g maple syrup

Preheat oven to 180c. Add pecans and walnuts to a (greaseproof paper) lined baking sheet. Top with oil, sugar, cinnamon, cayenne. Nutmeg, salt and **1 tbsp** maple syrup. Toss to coat. Bake for 6 minutes, toss/stir the bake for another 6 minutes until golden brown. Remove from the oven, drizzle with the other **1 tbsp** maple syrup. (Optional add a sprinkle of salt, cinnamon and sugar to coat.) Leave to cool completely, then place in jars/kilner jars.

Gingerbread Granola

DRY: 300g oats, 200g raw nuts (almonds, pecans, few walnuts), lightly chopped, 40g brown sugar, ¼ tsp salt, 1½ tsp ground cinnamon, 1 tbsp ground ginger. WET: 60ml coconut or olive oil, 80g maple syrup or honey, 25g brown sugar, 1 tsp vanilla essence.

Preheat the oven to 170C mix the dry ingredients in a large bowl. In a small saucepan warm the oil, syrup/honey, sugar and vanilla extract.

Pour over the dry ingredients and mix well. Spread evenly over 2 baking sheets and bake for 18-22 minutes stirring halfway through. (Watch it doesn't brown too quickly.) Remove from the oven and cool. Put into large jars/kilner jars.

Go to town on the presentation of your foodie gift using glass jars or cellophane bags tied with ribbons and of course Christmas tag.

The Chatterbox Cobalt Blue

Wintertime is a challenge for small birds like us. We stay put, remaining for the duration in the UK and very often we live close to where we hatched. My name is Cobalt and I am a blue tit, born and bred in Blunsdon. I realise that I'm not your traditional winter bird; that accolade belongs to the robin – the feisty, territorial singers that grace your Christmas cards.

Us blue tits face each winter with equal measures of determination and trepidation. A little bird like me weighs around 11 grams. My appetite is voracious as I need to consume almost my whole bodyweight in food each day just to make it safely through each bitter night. The shorter days mean I've less time to search out food and lay down fat stores which help me when the temperatures plummet and frost glistens on the ground. Snowflakes may fill humans with wonder but believe me, for us blue tits it's a real battle for survival. Food is harder to find in winter, especially in the quantities we need and competition for a good source of food is high. You may see us squabbling noisily as we scramble for a perch at a bird feeder. We like nothing better than to find a reliable, frequently filled feeder offering fat balls, sunflower hearts, peanuts and mealworms.

At night we fluff up our feathers to prevent heat loss and cosy-up with other garden birds for warmth in a hedge or bush or even a birdbox should we be lucky enough to find one. Fresh water is also more difficult to find when sources become frozen so I am especially grateful if I find a nice, clean, frost-free water bath. My needs are quite simple and I hope I can get safely through this tough season so I can start thinking about a warm and cosy nest for me and my lady next February. I just need to get through the here and now, saving my energy when I can, and constantly searching every waking moment for something to eat.

Christmas Eve night, myself and 11 others huddle together in the beech hedge. 'Come closer, Cobalt,' Carol requests as she makes space on the branch. As the falling frost twinkles on her blue and yellow feathers, I think she looks magical. She is, by far, the prettiest bird in the hedge and sings the sweetest songs I've ever heard. One-by-one, the lights go out in Blunsdon and as silence surrounds us, snowflakes begin to fall as Carol and I instinctively move closer, sharing our warmth. Christmas Day dawns. We stretch, shake the snow from our tiny feathers and carefully watch as two humans in coats and boots make footprints in the pristine snow. Tap, tap, tap! A human nails a little wooden box on to the wall while the other watches on, smiling. There's a small, bird-sized hole in the front of the box. I nod in approval. 'And something for them to eat,' says the other human, hanging feeders filled with mealworms and suet pellets on the apple tree. 'Happy Christmas, birds!' shout the humans, as they stamp their boots free of snow and head back into the house. 'It IS a happy Christmas, indeed,' I think as I turn to Carol still snuggled up beside me.


