#### A Recipe from CookFoodFan

#### Rich Pickings

This is the season of plentiful fruits and so enjoyable in this hot weather. As usual we have an abundance of eating apples raining from our tree – apple turnovers, stewed apples for the winter, pies, crumbles and chutney have been made. But now I

am going to forage for some free food from the hedgerows – blackberries. We are lucky living in Blunsdon because we have access to a lot of footpaths and fields to gather this luscious fruit. One of the best things about blackberries is that to freeze them they just need a wash first, box/bag up and label. But some will be for this recipe, a Blackberry and Lemon Upside-down Cake, a perfect summer recipe. Sweet and tart blackberries on top of a fluffy lemon flavoured sponge.

#### **Blackberry and Lemon Upside-down Cake** (serves 8-10)

175g unsalted butter, softened
175g caster sugar
3 eggs
115g self-raising flour, sifted
½ tsp baking powder
75g ground almonds
2 lemons, zested
250g blackberries, washed and dried

- 1. Heat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas mark 4.
- 2. Grease a 20 cm springform cake tin or line a 20cm cake tin.
- 3. In a bowl beat together the butter and sugar until pale and fluffy. Then one by one beat in the eggs.
- 4. Fold in the flour, baking powder, almond and lemon zest. Mix to just combine, don't overwork it.
- 5. Place into the blackberries in the bottom of the tin and squeeze over the juice of half a lemon. Lightly crush the berries then pour over the cake mix and smooth the top.
- 6. Bake for 45-50 minutes until the cake is golden brown and springy to the touch.

Delicious when served warm with cream, ice-cream or crème fraiche. Or cold with a cuppa.

#### The Chatterbox – The Written Word

An old school friend recently asked me if I still like to write as she could remember how I was always writing stories and poems when I was much younger. The answer is a resounding YES! I can't imagine not writing, although what I write these days tends to be just letters to keep in touch with friends or gathering my thoughts and feelings. Aside from creating stories as a child, whereby I'd usually either run my own riding school or own the best showjumper in the world, there were two main things that inspired me to write. The first was a long-running American television series which many people of a certain age will know called, 'The Waltons'. This wholesome, warm and gentle series consisted of mother, father, seven children and one set of grandparents living under the same roof in the mountains of West Virginia. The stories featured the highs and lows of a hard-working family during the Great Depression and World War II. The eldest son, John Boy, was an aspiring writer and each episode concluded with his reflection and rumination on what had occurred in that episode. Those few minutes before the credits ran kept me rivetted. I loved how he used that time and those words to sum up the conversations, mediocre meetings and greetings, daily chores and ordinary occurrences into something quite beautiful, captivating and though-provoking. Reflecting on the day's events was an opportunity to find meaning, experience emotional growth and understand the consequences of our own and others' actions on any given day. To an impressionable young girl, it seemed that writing could help me make sense of the world, which still feels true today. All credit to John Boy Walton!

The second thing that encouraged me to write as a means of expressing myself was brought about by reading the book, 'The Diary of Anne Frank' as a young teenager. Anne's terrible fate is well-documented, but it was a revelation to me how she used a diary as a friend and confidante and I, too, started writing a diary after reading it. Obviously, her situation of being hidden away during a terrifying period in history is both deeply moving and disturbing and she found some comfort in writing to Kitty. I wrote to Emmy and poured my heart and soul into those pages. I make no comparison between my life and Anne Franke's as mine was safe and ordinary - the minutiae of the school day, getting told off by a teacher, arguing with a parent, talking to my best friend on the phone is all there. My diary was a place to unload and an opportunity to say what was really on my mind, in private.

Writing has often been used as a tool in dealing with traumatic incidents. Putting the experience down on paper, turning feelings into words can be powerful and healing. Many have written about harrowing experiences such as being held as a hostage in a hostile country or surviving a natural disaster, for example. Focusing on the emotions and writing down the experience brings it to the fore rather than pushing it back down.

I feel incredibly lucky that I have this outlet here to express the things that pop into my head, whether it's something I've seen on TV, a memory that's cropped up or maybe an emotion I'd like to share. Thank you for reading the words that I write. I hope the month ahead is a good one for you.

It is a vintage from 2019, which also happens to be a great vintage year for English Cricket! My pairing recommendation for all of these bottles is England Cricket, the Biography by Simon Wilde; another expert in his field and taught me all I need to know in order to enjoy these wonderful wines- and when I attended my first local cricket match! And talking of raising a glass of English fizz; mine goes up to the inspiring Lionesses; the epitome of never give up! There is a huge variety of books you can learn more about these gamechangers, from Ella Toone's Not so Secret Diary of a Footballer for younger readers to Beth Mead's, Lionesses; my journey to glory, a real look at mental health and emotions that will inspire you even if you are not a football fan. If biographies aren't your thing, there is plenty of sporting fiction from Off Track; an F1 based love story to Behind the Games; an Olympic dreams story to The Cheat Sheeta dancer and an American footballer find more in common than they first thought. I've also thoroughly enjoyed a new series called Pitching Up, by Deborah Aubrey; based on a group of unlikely friends that bond during a camping trip. 
