

His local knowledge and wide council experience will be missed, along with the stories he can tell about the village (and some of the villagers!). We hope your health improves as you enjoy your well-earned retirement. A massive thank you and good luck old friend.

We have also lost another great friend to the Parish. **Mark Jones** our Caretaker has also left us for pastures new. He has been a stalwart over nearly 20 years looking after the Parish assets and freeing the community of litter. We will miss the jingle of his keys, his cheery smile and chat around the village. Thank you Mark for all you have done in your time with us, and good luck in your new job.

June was not quite as 'flaming' as we hoped it would be, but the growth of grass, trees and shrubs has been enormous. So much so that we have again had to intervene and do the Borough's work along footpaths and verges. Thankfully our trusty **Parish Clirs Nash and Tayler** have worked hard to improve these overgrown areas. Thank you to them for their hard work. If you have shrubs or trees or any growth next to a footway, can you please ensure they are trimmed and don't impede any users as they pass your property. Please ensure that there are no nesting birds before you do any major work. Thank you.

We also have the same issue with overgrown graves and plots in the Cemetery. We are going to take a pragmatic view of this issue – if the grave or plot looks unsafe, appears abandoned or neglected or the ownership rights have expired (over 75 years) we will instruct our grounds maintenance team to intervene and take responsibility and make it safe/tidy it up. We will not take over ownership just maintenance. If you have a loved one in the cemetery and you don't want this to happen, please let us know. Otherwise please have a look and make sure it is maintained, thank you.



## A Recipe from CookFoodFan

**Spanish Tastes** 

All this sunny weather makes you long for holidays, laid back ways of life in different cultures where time seems to slow down. Having enjoyed a week of tapas and vino tinto I have chosen a recipe with all the tastes of Spain, it's easy, is cooked in one pan, tastes delicious and is a low-fat fiesta of a dish.

#### Spanish-Style Chicken Bake (serves 4)

1 medium onion, cut into 8 wedges 1 medium red onion, cut into 8 wedges

500g new potatoes, quartered lengthways (so they are thin)

8 whole garlic cloves, unpeeled 8 medium tomatoes, quartered 75g chorizo 8 boneless, skinless chicken thighs

½ tsp sweet smoked paprika ½ tsp dried oregano

1 green pepper, deseeded and cut into stripes

Salt and black pepper

- 1. Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas mark 6. Put the onions, potatoes, garlic and tomatoes into a large roasting tin and season with salt and lots of black pepper. Toss everything together and roast for 25mins.
- 2. While the vegetables are roasting, skin the chorizo and cut into 5mm slices. Put the chicken thighs on a board and slash each 2 or 3 times with a knife. Season all over with black pepper. Mix the oregano and paprika together and set aside.
- 3. Take the roasting tin out of the oven, scatter the chorizo over the veg and turn everything a couple of times. Place the chicken on top of the vegetables and chorizo and sprinkle with the paprika and oregano mix. Season with a little salt, return to the oven and roast for another 20mins.
- 4. Take the tin out of the oven, tip it so you can get at the juices to drizzle over the chicken. Tuck the pepper stripes around the chicken and vegetables.
- 5. Turn the oven up to 220C/200C fan/gas mark 7. Put the tin back in the oven for a further 20mins until the chicken is golden and crisp.
- 6. Serve. As you eat the meal squeeze the garlic out of the skin to enjoy the deliciously soft flesh.

(You may need a piece of bread to soak up the juices.)

Fancy some Aioli (garlic mayonnaise) on the side?

Here's a cheat's recipe:

Mix together 240g ready-made mayonnaise, 2 to 3 finely grated garlic cloves, a pinch of salt and 1-2 tsp lemon juice. Taste and then season with more salt or lemon juice.

#### **Reading with Wine**



Hello Sunshine! I hope you have all enjoyed the glorious weather that we've been having, especially if you took some time to enjoy some of the Rosés that I mentioned last month- Rosé in the sunshine is a hard combination to beat!

It's official, summertime reading is here so I'm recommending holiday reads. First up, Hester and Harriet, by Hilary Spiers. Two sisters decide that their sixties is time to travel, and they head off to Italy in search of adventure...and find more than they bargained for. I loved this one for a few reasons, firstly all the delicious food and wine; perfection. Secondly, the generation crossover between them and their nephew is just lovely to read about; even if things do go wrong on a couple of occasions. Thirdly, the lovely sense of community that grows throughout the book- plus a dash of romance too. Finally, there is a mystery to solve which I wasn't expecting- it quite simply has everything for a summer recommendation! Its pairing is obvious but at the same time difficult as there is so much choice; because there is so much to celebrate, I am going with an Aldi Costellore Sparkling Rosé. In a beautiful bottle, it will feel like a treat, but it's only  $\mathfrak{L}7.25$  If you are looking for a summer gift, I promise you this one will go down well...as it did for the Blunsdon residents who happen to receive one from me-double guarantee.

Another pick is **The Orange House** by Isabelle Broom. I was lucky enough to be invited to the launch of this one, and hearing the author talk about their writing, always brings the story to life. Henry and Violet are gifted a beautiful house in the hills of Majorca but it is something of a fixer upper. As they navigate life in two countries and raising a son with neuro diverse needs, life is not as idyllic as one might think. When all reaches rock bottom, quite literally in one section, it is a question of do they give up, paper over the cracks or build on what they had? I loved the honesty of life from Violet's perspective, which is ironic, as she is keeping a big secret. As you'd expect there were also a fair few options for wine pairings but the one that I kept coming back to is an Orange Sangria that I tried at the Asda Wine Event; and was lucky enough to come home with a recipe card. Start with a bottle of the Gros Manseng Vin Orange (also at a good price £8.13), add a cup of sliced peaches, an orange, a lime, one cup of strawberries, ½ cup of fruit juice, ¼ cup of brandy and ¾ cup of peach schnapps- add all into a jug and stir to combine. My advice is let the flavours come together and chill in the fridge a couple of hours before serving-you'll be the hostess with the mostest at any summer party! Just like Violet would like to be at The Orange House...and of course, the orange connection makes it a perfect match. Orange wine is currently causing quite the divide so I'd love to hear your thoughts...I thought I was in one camp but this Sangria has swayed me permanently!

Read as much as you can in these longer evenings, but please drink responsibly. Reading with Wine


