## Welcome to the October Tilbrook Village Newsletter

### BOILER REPLACEMENT

Some good news and some not so good.

The new boiler is in and working well. The hot water cylinder has been re-sited to the rear of the boiler room. We now have hot-water, we have more space in the boiler room for the pending room alterations and we have heat in the toilets and kitchen.

Unfortunately, there remains an issue with the underfloor heating circuits in the main hall. The problem has been investigated and probable solution agreed upon, we are hopeful that this will be resolved before Christmas.

In the meantime, we still have the wall mounted infra-red heaters in the main hall and four portable electric radiate heaters.

If using the latter, please ensure they are operated safely away from children and vulnerable people.

The problem with the slow filling of the toilet cisterns in the ladies' and gents' toilets has been resolved, so we are now feeling "flushed" with success.

### FIRST AID TRAINING SESSION

Victoria Coles (aided by James French) delivered the First Aid awareness training session on 21<sup>st</sup> November in the village hall to 14 residents where a wide range of topics were covered including:

- CPR - Cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- AED -Automated External Defibrillator
- Bleeds
- Choking
- Burns
- Anaphylaxis - Autoinjectors (EPIPENS)

All participants were invited to take part in practical exercises and all felt it was extremely useful and that Victoria did an excellent job of comprehensively presenting all the subjects in way that was easy to understand.

We are planning to hold another session in the spring of next year out of normal working hours so that those who are working will be able to attend. Numbers have to be limited for practical reasons and those people who are on the waiting list from the first session will be given priority for the next session.

Our next Communion service will be on Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> January at 11am.




The PCC would like to wish all villagers a very healthy and happy Christmas, and we look forward to seeing you on the 13<sup>th</sup>.

I tempted fate in my last news with the comment, that with only two calves left to be born, we looked like having a season with nothing born dead. The next calf was stillborn a few days later. So, we have ended up with one set of twins, and one born dead out of almost 70 calvings, still a good performance.

The bulls run with the cows again from the 1<sup>st</sup> December to produce next Autumn's calves. We recently did a fertility check, with the vet, on our main stock bull, Tilbrook Elite.

The result was unsatisfactory, and he could be described as "firing blanks most of the time". He will be leaving us shortly aged 6 years and can be described as having had a very good innings. Several years ago, his semen was collected and thousands of straws have been sold to numerous breeders around the world, and he has given us over 100 calves here at Tilbrook. It is a shame when a stalwart leaves, but this day was semi expected and a replacement bull was bought a few months ago.



A roadworks gang have been putting a new electric cable in from Kimbolton to Molesworth over the last 6 months, and for the last few years we have benefited from full-fibre connection into the farm. On 8<sup>th</sup> October as they were digging past the farm, they broke our connection, and it's only when you are without the internet that you realise how much you rely on modern technology. For the first day or two it was a bit frustrating, and we were assured that all would be good and reconnected within a week. However, a simple break was all too much for them, and using the phone with 4G does a bit, but not a lot. It won't run the television. After many visits from Openreach, phone calls with AI machines and finally with emails to the top of Openreach, we were connected again last week. It was a very long wait.

The farm shop is gearing up for a busy period supplying our home-produced beef, and many people will be enjoying local food for their Christmas lunch.

*In Summary:*


Before Christmas, the usual bins will be collected one day early.
